- Electric generators in station power disputes.
- A transmission owner in a \$500 million dispute concerning the allocation of SECAs following the elimination of "through and out rates" in the Midwest ISO and PJM.
- A transmission owner in a PJM rate design proceeding.
- A transmission owner in transmission cost allocation proceedings in the Midwest ISO.

Each of these cases involved complex economic and engineering testimony on topics ranging from interconnection or transmission system development to market design. Building off these experiences, our attorneys are able to mold abstruse evidence and expert testimony into arguments that tell a story that can be understood and believed.

Additionally, we have represented clients during the judicial review of FERC cases. For example, we have successfully represented:

- A transmission owner in the allocation of new PJM-planned transmission costs.
- A group of electric generators in a dispute concerning the applicability of the FERC's ex parte rules to market monitors.
- Electric generators in a station power dispute that confirmed a generator's right to self-supply station power.
- Electric generators in a dispute concerning the NYISO capacity market.
- An electric generator in an NYISO refund proceeding.
- A municipality in a hydroelectric proceeding.
- An interstate natural gas shipper company in a transportation rate dispute.

Our Energy attorneys also litigate disputes in federal and state courts. In federal court, we have represented clients in contract disputes between electric generators or marketers and electric utilities. At the state level, we have represented generators in RTO role disputes. Further, our attorneys handle arbitrations to resolve contractual disputes ranging from warranty issues on generation project parts to station power issues.
